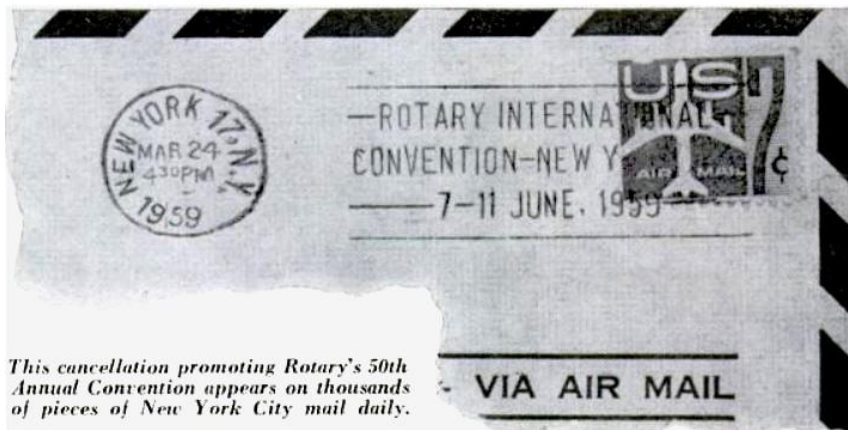

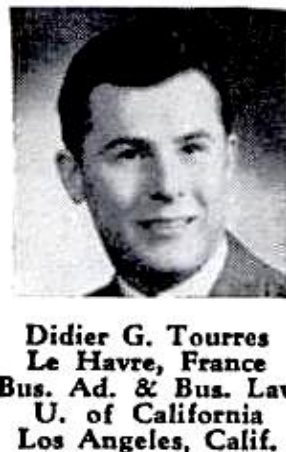

AGE— *It's a Mood*

Few men have accepted the passing of their years with more aplomb than genial Maurice Duperrey, 1937-38 President of Rotary International, who recently celebrated his 80th birthday in the company of his fellow Rotarians of Paris, France. His remarks on that occasion (condensed and translated from the French) comprise a warm reminder that age is really a relative thing.

To end my acknowledgment, I will recite a few lines after the manner of our genial Ronsard:

*Lorsque je serai vieux, le soir à la chandelle
Assis près du foyer, du Rotary rêvant,
Dirai, me souvenant de mes quatre vingts ans
J'avais de bons amis et la vie était belle.*

*(When I'll be old, by candlelight at evening
Near the hearth besetted, and about Rotary dreaming,
I'll say, my 80th year recalling,
Good friends did I then have, and life was pleasing.)*

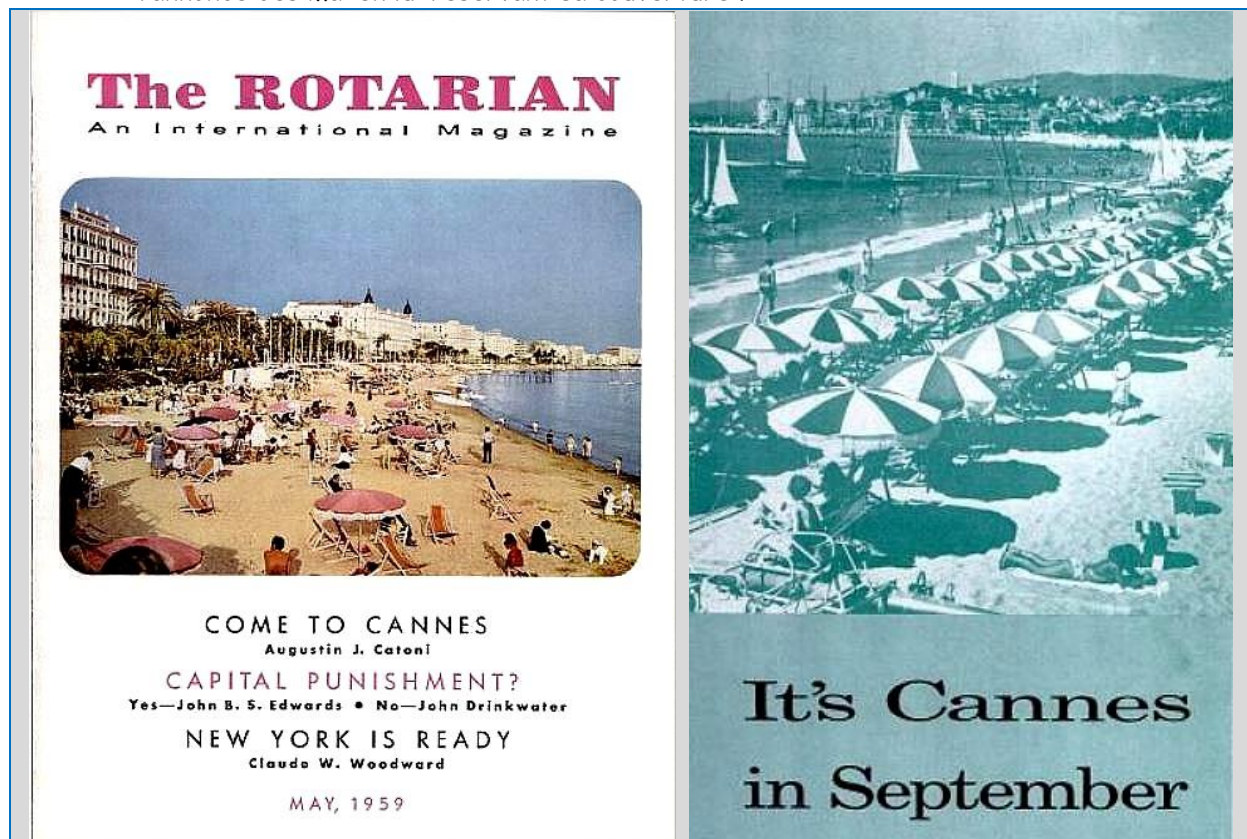

ENAEM Region

The sixth regional conference for the European, North African and Eastern Mediterranean region will be held in Cannes, France, 25-28 September, 1959. It is expected that thousands of Rotarians and their guests from at least thirty countries or geographical regions will be present. The languages in use at the conference will be: English, French, German, Italian and Swedish.

The 1959 ENAEM regional conference committee, with members from six countries, met last year and laid plans for the conference. The Rotary Club of Cannes is at work on hospitality plans.

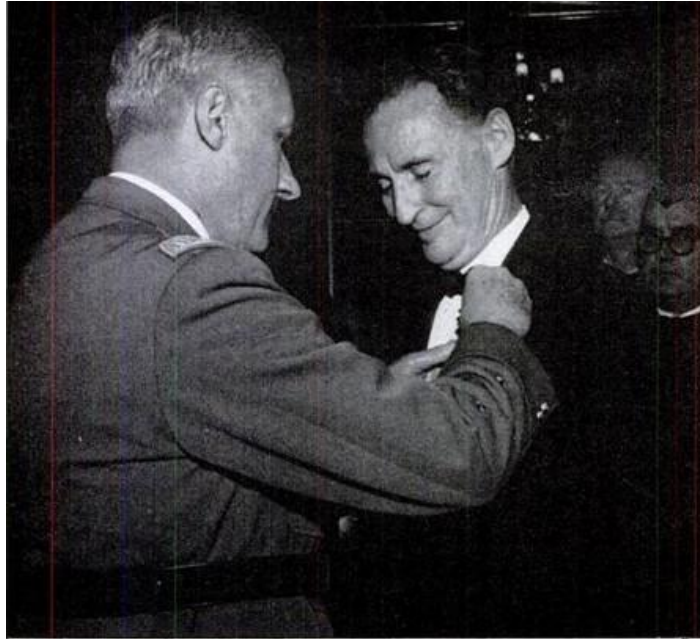

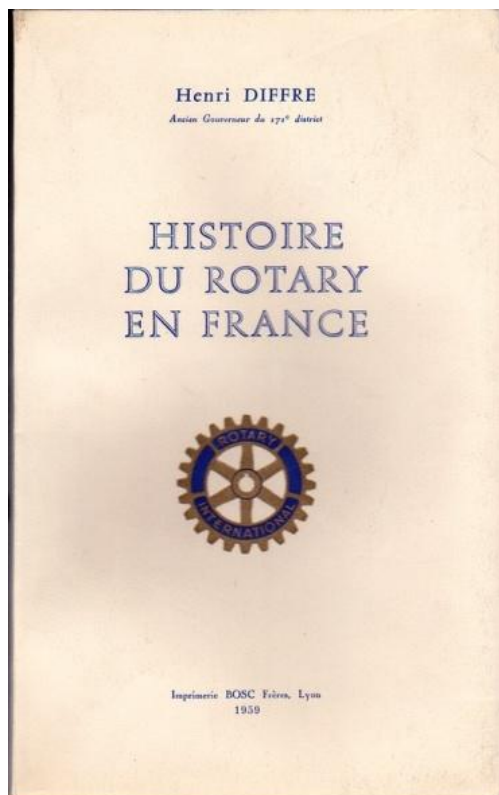

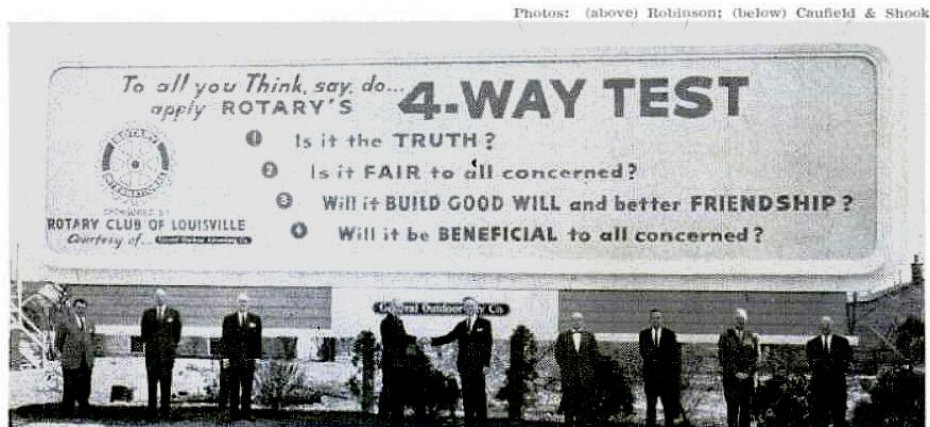

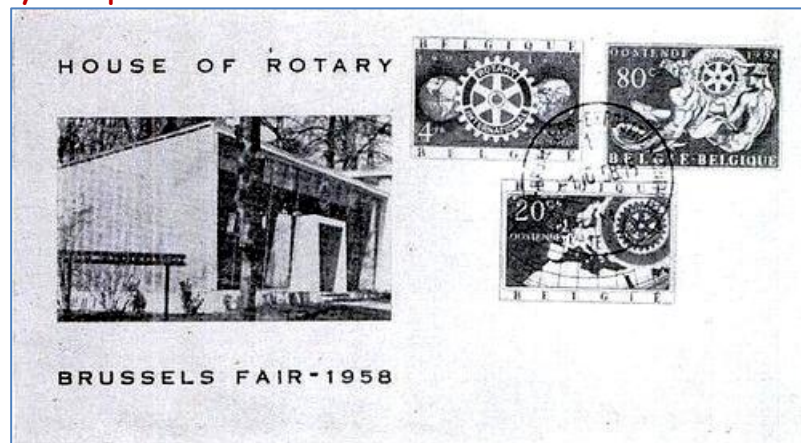

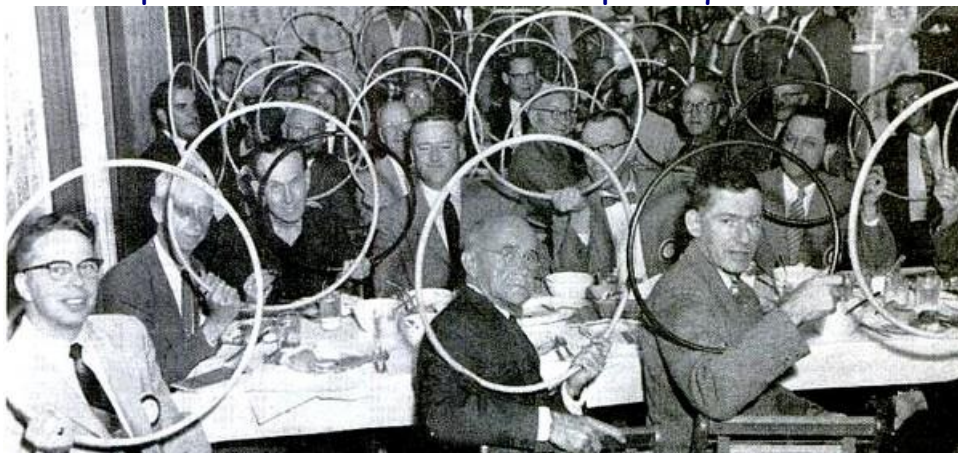

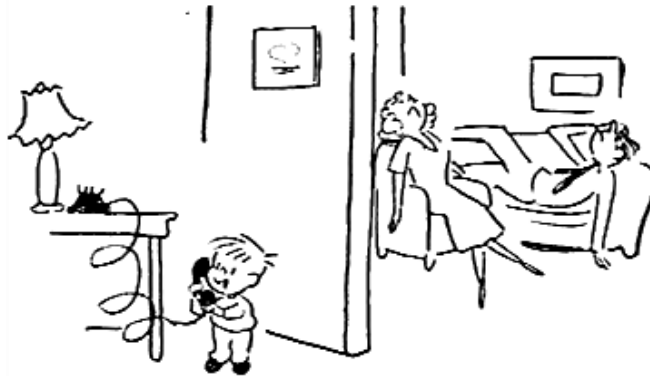
